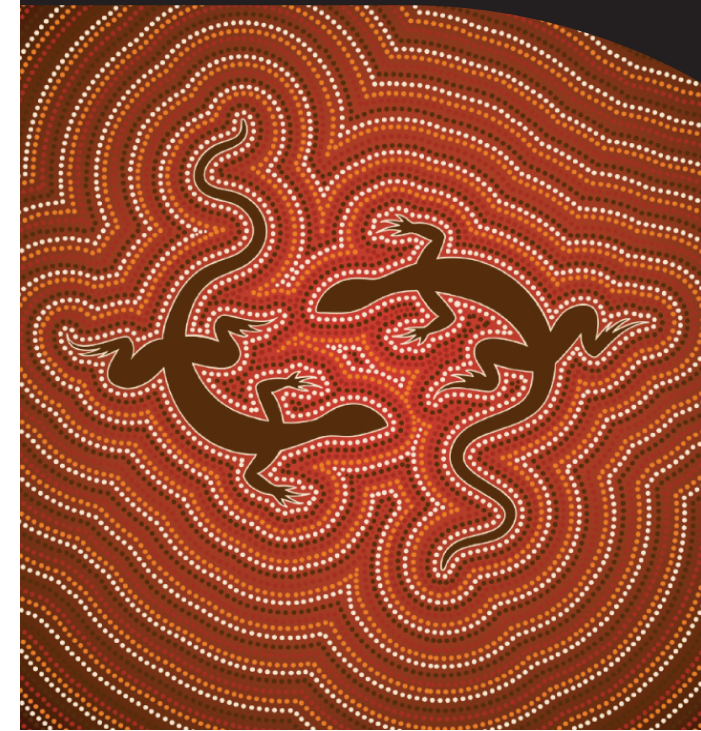

The ASD will benefit the entire SA community and beyond who are looking for Aboriginal specific organisations and services.

Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP)

The RAP program is a framework for organisations to realise their vision for reconciliation. Through the program, organisations develop a RAP—a business plan that documents what an organisation commits to do to contribute to reconciliation in Australia. A RAP will enable Catalyst Foundation to commit to implementing and measuring practical actions that build respectful relationships and create opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
